Pennsylvania FIRST Robotics strives to provide a safe environment for students at our events. As part of this effort, volunteers and adults affiliated with a Team to follow Pennsylvania laws and FIRST's policies.

Pennsylvania Child Protection Services Laws

In 2014 and 2015 the Pennsylvania legislature updated the [Child Protection Services Law](#) changing how Pennsylvania responds to child abuse. These changes affect the reporting, investigation, assessment, prosecution and judicial handling of child abuse and neglect cases. Beginning August 25, 2015, many adult volunteers required to obtain background checks, including the Child Abuse History Clearance, issued by the Department of Human Services, and the Criminal History Record issued by the Pennsylvania State Police.

Cost & Registration

What does it cost to participate? There are costs involved with fielding a *FIRST*Tech Challenge team and they can vary from team to team and region to region depending on what level of participation the team chooses.

Here are some basic cost parameters:

- The *FIRST*Tech Challenge registration for North American teams is \$275 each season. International team registration varies by location.
- The average season costs per, including: team registration, a robot kit of parts, event registration, travel, and additional costs for rookie teams is approximately \$2,500.
- The robot kit of parts is reusable each season, so veteran teams can expect to pay less.
- The *FIRST*Tech Challenge registration for North American teams is \$275 each season. International team registration varies by location.
- The average season costs per, including: team registration, a robot kit of parts, event registration, travel, and additional costs for rookie teams is approximately \$2,500.
- The robot kit of parts is reusable each season, so veteran teams can expect to pay less.
- *FIRST* offers many fundraising tools and teams are encouraged to create their own opportunities. Grants may also be available, as well as sponsorships provided locally, regionally and nationally by many corporations.
- All costs for individual team members are assumed by the team as a group.

7.0 Judging & Award Criteria

7.1 Overview

This section provides a complete description of all of the FTC Awards; the judging process, award criteria, Engineering Notebook guidelines, and philosophy that Teams need to be aware of in preparation for participating at FTC Tournaments.

Teams have spent a significant amount of time designing, building, programming their Robot, and learning what it takes to be part of a Team. For many FTC Teams, the event is the reward for all their hard work throughout the season. While there are several types of events, they all offer a fun and exciting way for Teams to demonstrate the result of their efforts.

The judged awards represent a positive way we recognize Teams who embody important values like Gracious Professionalism™, Teamwork, creativity, innovation, and the value of the engineering design process. These judging guidelines are a part of the road map to success.

FTC judging sessions do not include written or verbal feedback for students. FTC judging is a subjective process; and students are encouraged to learn the important life skill of self-evaluation. 7.2 FTC Award Eligibility

To ensure fairness to all Teams and to provide equal opportunity for all Teams to win an award at an FTC Championship tournament, Teams are only eligible to win an award at the first three Championship tournaments that they attend in a season. Those Teams who compete in more than three Qualifying Tournament, League Championships, and Championship tournaments do so for the purpose of being involved in the fun and excitement of the tournament and not with the intention of winning awards or advancing to the next tournament level.

Minimum Requirements for Awards

Upgrade Your Modern Robotics Firmware!

- Version 2.0 Firmware Now Available from Modern Robotics
 - Field upgradable firmware. Future firmware releases upgraded from your pc.
 - Servo Controller - Advanced user function to allow selection of the servo range (standard range or extended range) varying the limits for each servo.
 - Motor Controller - Select the DC motor type for each motor port to set the control loop parameters to run each type of motor at maximum efficiency (Matrix, NeveRest, and Tetrix motors supported)
- Cost: \$5 to \$12 Each Depending on Number of Devices Upgraded
 - Includes Servo Controller, Motor Controller, Device Interface Module, and Legacy Module
- Approximately 2 weeks turn-around time including shipping.

FIRST Recommends Android Studio Upgrade

- Upgrade to Version 2.1.x
 - Current version will be uninstalled during the upgrade
 - Takes about an hour
