

Awards and Advancement Updates in Game Manual Part 1

7.2 Eligibility for Judged Awards

Teams are eligible to be considered for all Judged Awards except the Inspire Award ... at <u>any one of the</u> <u>first three events</u> they participate in at each of the following levels.

• League Tournament • Qualifying Tournament • Super Qualifying Tournament • Championship Tournament

7.2.1 Inspire Award Eligibility

Teams that have won the Inspire Award at another event of the same level, <u>regardless of the region</u>, cannot be considered for the Inspire Award or as an Inspire Award Finalist at additional events at that level.

7.3 Eligibility for Advancement

Teams are eligible for advancement at any one of the first three events they participate in at any of the following levels, <u>regardless of the region</u>.

• League Tournament • Qualifying Tournament • Super Qualifying Tournament • Championship Tournament

Award and advancement opportunities now consider events participated in across all states and regions

Qualifier Registration



<u>Pennsylvania Teams</u>

Qualifiers

- 1st Preference > Registered List
 assuming space available
- 2nd Preference > 2nd Priority Waitlist
- 3rd Preference > 3rd Priority Waitlist
- ... and so on

Out of State Teams

Qualifiers

- Offset is TWO
- 1st Preference > 3nd Priority Waitlist
- 2nd Preference > 4rd Priority Waitlist
- 3rd Preference > 5th Priority Waitlist
- ... and so on

Registration for Qualifiers opens this evening!

Same as Last Season
Qualifier Preferences, Registered Lists and Wait Lists

When registering for Qualifiers, consider award and advancement changes if you plan to compete in other states or regions

Invoices and Receipts

- Invoices
 - Invoices are now online
 - Two emails when team added to Registered List
 - Registration confirmation email
 - Invoice email that contains link to invoice
 - View, download, or print your invoice
 - Option to pay directly online
- Receipts
 - Invoice marked paid once payment is processed
 - This paid invoice is your receipt
 - Email with link to paid invoice sent








Invoices now online. Paid invoice is your receipt.

Payment Options and Due Dates

- Payment Options
 - Check, credit card, debit card, and ACH bank transfer
- Payment Due Date
 - Three (3) weeks after date of registration confirmation email or two (2) weeks before event date, whichever is earlier
 - If payment is not received by due date, team is automatically removed from Registered List and slot offered to next eligible team
- 2017-2018 Rates
 - Qualifiers, including Philadelphia Qualifier: \$125
 - State Championship: \$275
 - Online payment convenience fee waived







Credit cards now accepted for payment. Fee due 3 weeks after team is registered for event.

Pennsylvania FIRST Robotics strives to provide a safe environment for students at our events. As part of this effort, volunteers and adults affiliated with a Team to follow Pennsylvania laws and FIRST's policies.

Pennsylvania Child Protection Services Laws

In 2014 and 2015 the Pennsylvania legislature updated the Child Protection Services Law changing how Pennsylvania responds to child abuse. These changes s affect the reporting, investigation, assessment, prosecution and judicial handling of child abuse and neglect cases. Beginning August 25, 2015, many adult volunt required to obtain background checks, including the Child Abuse History Clearance, issued by the Department of Human Services, and the Criminal History Rec issued by the Pennsylvania State Police.

- The Pennsylvania FIRST Robotics FTC Program Consent and Release Form is not required this season
- The FIRST Consent and Release Form is required for all students, mentors, coaches, and volunteers at all Pennsylvania FTC Workshops, Scrimmages, Qualifiers, and State Championship
 - Electronic or paper form acceptable. If paper, it must be presented at each event
 - For students, form must be signed by parent or legal guardian not coach
- Those without signed a FIRST C&R Form are welcome to watch the event from the stands, but may not participate in the event
 - Not allowed in the Pits or in the Competition area



10.0 Judging & Award Criteria

10.1 Overview

This section provides descriptions of all the *FIRST* Tech Challenge Awards; the judging process, award criteria, Engineering Notebook guidelines, and philosophy that *Teams* need to be aware of in preparation for participating at *FIRST* Tech Challenge Tournaments.

Teams have spent a significant amount of time designing, building, programming their *Robot*, and learning what it takes to be part of a *Team*. For many *Teams*, the Event is the reward for all their hard work throughout the season. While there are several types of Events, they all offer a fun and exciting way for *Teams* to show the results of their efforts.

The judged awards represent a positive way we recognize *Teams* who embody important values like *Gracious Professionalism*[®], Teamwork, creativity, innovation, and the value of the engineering design process. These judging guidelines are a part of the road map to success.

FIRST Tech Challenge judging sessions do not include written or verbal feedback for students. The judging is a subjective process; and students are encouraged to learn the important life skill of self-evaluation. This helps students prepare for professional interviews while developing other real world life skills. Each Hub (Max. 2 Per Robot):

- 4 Motors (with encoders)

- Analog (4), I2C (4), Digital (8)
- Bosch 9 axis IMU

Pros:

- Cheaper
- Fewer Wires
- Integrated IMU

Cons:

- New Motor Connectors
- Smaller Footprint
 New Power Connectors




Blocks Programming Tool
